Testimony John Matthew Szymanski Only by His Grace, Love and Mercy

For most of my life, from birth until I was 22, I was deeply involved in the church community. During this time, I was a Catholic Christian, baptized as a child and attending mass every Sunday. At 22, I was invited to a Baptist church, where I learned about the plan of salvation and accepted Jesus as my savior. I thought I had secured my place in heaven. Although there was a transformation within me, not everything was resolved. I developed a desire to read and study the Bible and wanted to share the message of salvation through Jesus with my family. During this period, I accepted the truth, repented, acknowledged my deserving of hell, and awaited judgment without expecting mercy. Then Jesus/Yeshua approached me with grace, mercy, love, and peace, lifting me up and teaching me. For the first time, I embraced the fruits of the spirit, and the love within me grew, extending to others. I became part of the True Church of Believers, with Jesus/Yeshua as my sustenance and greatest treasure. Now, He knows all my secrets, and we have a real relationship. My life is now focused on walking the narrow path, seeking guidance from my King, engaging in humble conversations.
